<u>Circuit of Madrid Jarama</u> - RACE

was built in 1967, being the first permanent circuit in Spain. It has hosted 9 F1 GPs and 16 Moto GPs. The circuit is nowadays a multifunctional venue, with more than 6.000m2 of meeting and exhibition facilities distributed along the new Jarama Paddock Club. In addition, it offers training through RACE Driving School for more than 15.000 persons each year.

The Circuit has a main racetrack of 3.850m, an off-road track and two additional training tracks. Furthermore, the circuit offers a wide range of leisure activities for all kind of publics.

- Duration: minimum 60 seconds.
- ① Number of runs per competitor: 2
- ① 1 run will be in the camera car and 1 run in a non-camera car.
- Test run: No
- © Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust the seat and steering wheel position.

Description:

- On the camera car, all windows and mirrors (except windscreen) will be covered to restrict
 the drivers view. On the non-camera car all windows and mirrors will not be covered.
- The route (giant slalom) is marked by cones. Competitors must drive between 2 cones (gate).
- First a competitor drives the giant slalom forwards. At the end of the course the competitor needs to drive in reverse, negotiate the giant slalom.

(1) Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they
sit in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.







#6 TASKS

NO.2: WET SLALOM (ON A MIXED SURFACE)

- Duration: minimum 60 seconds.
- O Number of runs per competitor: 2
- Type of vehicles: different type of vehicles (manual/automatic transmission/BEV) will be used for each run.
- Test run: No
- Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust the seat and steering wheel position.

Description:

- The route (giant slalom) is marked by cones. The competitor must drive between the 2 cones (gate).
- Part of the course is on a slippery (wet) surface and part is on normal (dry) tarmac.

(2) Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they
sit in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.







- Duration: maximum time must be defined.
- O Number of run per competitor: 1
- Test run: No
- © Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust seat & steering wheel position.

Description:

- The route (giant slalom) is marked by cones. The competitor must drive between the 2 cones (gate).
- The course must be set in a way not to allow a higher speed of travel.
- The Instructor sits in the car in passenger seat.
- A maximum time limit will be defined for this task.

① Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they sit in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.









6 TASKS

NO.4: PARKING PARCOURS

- Duration: minimum 60 seconds.
- ① Number of run per competitor: 1
- ① 1 car with manual transmission.
- Test run: No
- © Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust seat & steering wheel position.

② Description:

- Part of the course is also a parking place that must use nearside or offside reverse parking.
 When the parking manoeuvre is complete, a competitor needs to remain in place for 10 seconds to allow the judges to measure the distance from the car to the cones.
- Part of the course is a garage, marked by plastic barriers or by cones. The competitor drives into the garage, makes a U (180 degree) turn and then drives out of the garage.
- A maximum time limit will be defined for this task.

(P) Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they sit in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.







NO.5: BOWL SLALOM

- Duration: minimum 60 seconds.
- Dumber of runs per competitor: 2.
- Type of vehicles: different type of vehicles (manual/automatic transmission/BEV) will be used for each run.
- Test run: No
- © Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust the seat & steering wheel position.

Description:

- The route (giant slalom) is marked by cones. The competitor must drive between 2 cones (gate).
- Part of the course can be (not mandatory) on a slippery (wet) surface.
- On the bonnet of the car a bowl is mounted and contains a ball. The ball is fixed to the bowl with rope.
- If the ball falls out of the bowl, the competitor must stop and put the ball back to the container.
- A maximum time limit will be defined for this task.

Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they sit
in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.









#6 TASKS

NO.6: ROLL CAR/EASY DRIFT

- Duration: minimum 60 seconds. There should be 2 runs (both runs with the same car).
- ① One car with manual transmission is needed for this task.
- ① Number of runs per competitor: 1 (car will be fixed with Easy Drift)
- Test run: No
- Competitors can have a test run <u>outside the course</u> to adjust the seat & steering wheel position.

Description:

- The route (giant slalom) is marked by cones. Competitors must drive between 2 cones (gate).
- A maximum time limit will be defined for this task.

Timing:

The time is measured by a tablet, the competitor needs to start the timing watch before they
sit in the car. The competitor also stops the timing watch when they finish the task.

Since April 20, 2022, the Spanish government lifted the requirement to wear face masks in most indoor settings. Masks must still be worn on all public transport, in hospitals, retirement homes, healthcare centres and chemists. Other establishments, private institutions and businesses must determine whether they require or recommend people wear them on their premises.
